Tours/Activities: Throughout the year, various school, church, and family groups toured the Museum, including the following:

- A group of 16 visitors from Kentucky, led by Lenwood Jefferson, an alum of HI who served 27 years in the military.

Announcements for the 2024 HI Scholarships were sent via email on February 8, 2024, to all high schools in Vance County. Completed applications must be returned by March 19, 2024. The Applications process also includes an interview with the Henderson Institute Scholarship Committee. The program was created to recognize and support County High School Seniors academic futures and as an investment in the local communities' future goals. Applicants must have excelled in their subject area and must be pursuing higher education at an accredited college or university. Funding is made available to cover a portion of their related school expenses from their freshman year and beyond Awards are made based on merit and community involvement. Recipients are notified of the results by a letter sent to them no later than the first Tuesday in May. School Counselors are also notified of these awards. Eligible students are Vance County seniors, or seniors who can establish legacy (descendent of a graduate or former student of Henderson Institute). Students must meet the established criteria as outlined on the Henderson-Institute Website
