ROBERT BOGAN NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP



The Henderson Institute Alumni Association is proud to announce that Maya Jean Lloyd is the 2024 recipient of the Robert Bogan National Scholarship. A graduate of Vance Charter School, Maya is the daughter of Chad and Sara Lloyd. She will be attending Auburn University, Auburn Alabama, in August where she plans to major in Business.

While at Vance Charter, Maya served as Vice President of the Student Government Organization and President of the Dark Knights and was a member of the Leadership team of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, JROTC and VCHS Honor Society.

Established in 2007, the Robert Bogan Scholarship is awarded annually to a student who has a positive attitude, has actively planned a career path, and is motivated to make a difference in the community. Maya will receive a \$1,000.00 recurring scholarship for four years if she maintains a 2.5 grade-point average or higher, for a total of \$4,000.00. The money is to be used for tuition or other university expenses.

Alfred St. Baptist Church's Annual HBCU Scholarship Festival 2023 Update

The Alfred Street Baptist Church's Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCU) Festival continues to annually bring high school juniors and seniors from across the country and HBCU representatives together. The event is an opportunity for students to learn about the variety of academic programs and financial funding that HBCUs offer. Henderson Institute is in its third year of partnering with the Vance County Board of Education in providing Vance County college-bound students the opportunity to actively participate in the Scholarship Festival.
