A STATEMENT FROM THE SPORT RECORD

The gridiron season of the Henderson Institute Panthers was one of numerous achievements and excitements. The Panthers, boasting a very light team, opened the season by whipping Chapel Hill, an old rival, 12-0. The captains, Herman Jones and Eugene Nicholson, paced them to victory. In the Eastern AA Division play-off against Tarboro, the Panthers were beaten 33-6.
