We on the annual staff sincerely hope that this Panther will help you relive your high school days, and that it will find you closer to your present friends so they may not be forgotten later on.

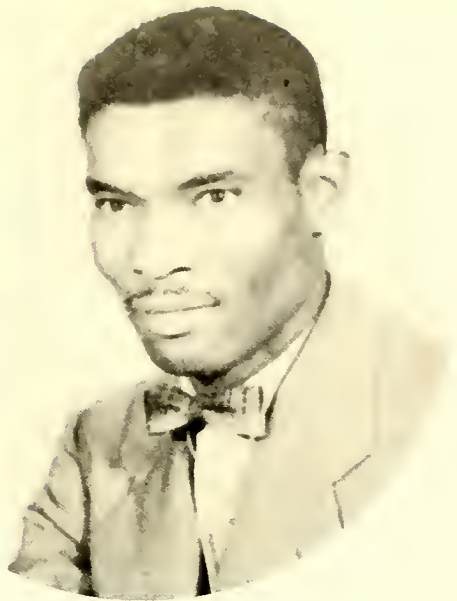

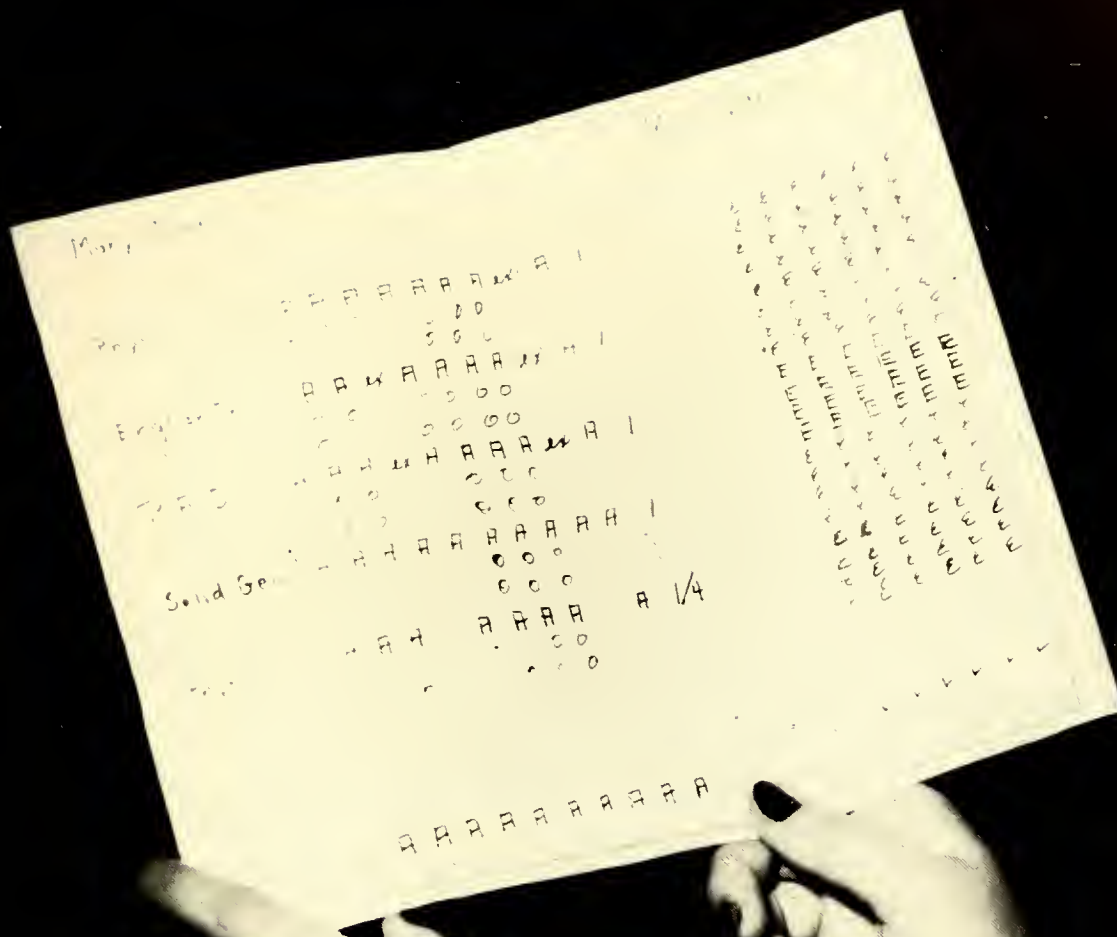

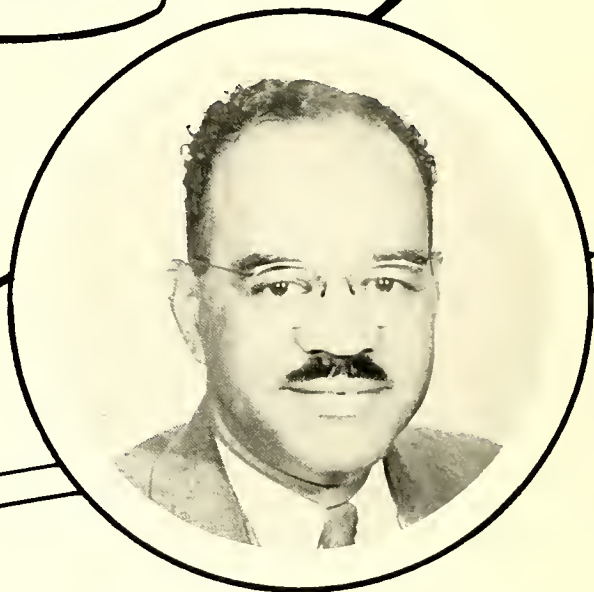
FACULTY
